



## Byways Auto Tour of the Delaware Bayshore



Traversing along tidal rivers and marshes, the Delaware Bayshore Byway is a collective system of outdoor experiences, wildlife conservation, and destination zones. The byway route supports the region's best ecotourism travel. Experience the byway by getting out of your vehicle to walk, bike, canoe or kayak, or boat. Lean and travel at your own pace, but take dozens of pictures beyond the byway corridor. Engage yourself outdoors and in places and special attraction activities of the Byway's River Towns. Safely encounter coastal marshes, open and active agricultural fields, forests, migratory birds, horseshoe crabs & other wildlife, and other historical places of interest where maritime living forms a lifestyle. Follow the auto tour signs along the byway route and use your [GIS Storybook maps](#) on your mobile phone.


### Experience Natural Areas, Beaches, Historic and Cultural Areas, and the Quaint Village River Town's

Key locations from north to south include:

Fleming's Landing, Woodland Beach and Woodland Beach Wildlife Area, DNREC's Aquatic Resource Education Center (AREC) Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge, Town of Leipsic and Town Hall, Port Mahon, Town of Little Creek and Little Creek Wildlife Area, Pickering Beach, Saint Jones area including Kitts Hummock. John Dickinson Plantation, St. Jones Reserve and Delaware National Estuary Research Reserve, Ted Harvey Conservation Area, and Air Mobility Museum, Town of Magnolia, North Bowers Beach and Bowers Beach Maritime Museum, Town of Frederica, Milford Neck Wildlife Area, City of Milford including Mispillion River Walk, historic downtown, and Vinyard Shipyard.
